*Endangered*

"The Great Barrier Reef, the world's largest living marine structure, is finding little reprieve from more intense and frequent marine heat waves brought on by climate change that cause devastating bleaching. Biologists predict that if we continue carrying on the way we are then by the end of this century 50% of species living today will face extinction. And humans are not immune. To see ourselves as different and separate to the ecology and ecosystem of our planet is leaving humanity unprepared.

We are mammals in a sensitive ecosystem, vulnerable to the same forces of climate change as every other living creature."
